

Introduction

gLINK is an Erasmus Mundus Action 2 (EMA2) Partnership of European and East Asian Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) aiming at fostering international cooperation, mutual enrichment and better understanding between the European Union (EU) and East Asia through the exchange of students, researchers, academics and staff. The partnership is composed of 9 European HEIs and 9 HEIs from Asian countries. The project offers a total of **163 scholarships** at undergraduate (UG), masters (MS), PhD, post-doctoral and academic staff levels. The project aims to deliver education, training, research experience and cross-fertilization of ideas in a number of thematic areas contributing towards, **smart green technologies, sustainability, learning and knowledge exchange.**


